Ruth and Boaz; The Genealogy of David

³Naomi her mother-in-law said to her, 'My daughter, I need to seek some security for you, so that it may be well with you. ²Now here is our kinsman Boaz, with whose young women you have been working. See, he is winnowing barley tonight at the threshing-floor. ³Now wash and anoint yourself, and put on your best clothes and go down to the threshing-floor; but do not make yourself known to the man until he has finished eating and drinking. ⁴When he lies down, observe the place where he lies; then, go and uncover his feet and lie down; and he will tell you what to do.' ⁵She said to her, 'All that you tell me I will do.' ^{Ruth 4: 13} So Boaz took Ruth and she became his wife. When they came together, the Lord made her conceive, and she bore a son. ¹⁴Then the women said to Naomi, 'Blessed be the Lord, who has not left you this day without next-of-kin;* and may his name be renowned in Israel! ¹⁵*He shall be to you a restorer of life and a nourisher of your old age;* for your daughter-in-law who loves you, who is more to you than seven sons, has borne him.' ¹⁶Then Naomi took the child and laid him in her bosom, and became his nurse. ¹⁷The women of the neighbourhood gave him a name, saying, 'A son has been born to Naomi.' But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. ²⁷And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement, ²⁸so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.
